#### **Brief Summary and Description**

The Muirhead Outreach Project is an early intervention, (non profit charity) support service that works with families and children, to keep them together through difficult and challenging times. We are a consent based service that aims to minimise the impact that ACES's and trauma has on families and help them break the cycle. We will work with families to identify the individual family need and how best to support them, to give them a


foundation on which they can build, either on their own or with the help of specialist support. We help families to have an increased sense of achievement and sense of belonging.

All newly referred families work through an 8-week foundation period where they learn about family routines, emotions, how to communicate in a positive way and how to effectively de-escalate. During this period, we work with the family as a whole – both parents and child (and anyone else that may stay in the home). We are unique locally, as we work with the entire family. We realise that sustainability means making changes for everyone in the home and, as a result of our inclusiveness, quality of life improves for all members of the family.

Our families can often feel isolated, helpless, hopeless, have low self-esteem and their children may be struggling in other areas such as education. By building positive relationships with people and teaching them how to do the same, we are helping families achieve a sense of belonging within their communities. The children we work with can often be targets for bullying or can be caught up in anti-social behaviour themselves. By building up their self-esteem and acting as positive role models we can show them that there are other possibilities. We work with some families from the most deprived areas in Fife, where waiting lists are high and resilience is low. Some of our families tend to suffer in silence and so when they finally do ask for help but are turned away, it can break their trust and leave them feeling further demoralised. Often in families, history has a way of repeating itself. Many of our parents experienced early trauma and that has had an impact on their relationship with their children. Our foundation work and additional services can help to break old habits and educate parents on other options.

Our Values are important in ensuring our community is getting the support they deserve. They show how we treat our families and colleagues and expect to be treated in return. They help us to align with other organisations who have similar values and ensure we can create sustainable change for the families

## NURTURE

We aim to give families the tools to repair, maintain and nurture themselves and relationships. We nurture our staff by having a caring work environment where their health and well-being are paramount.

The concept of nurturing highlights the importance of development especially in growing children. Creating nurturing environments helps children to also build important relationships and develop a sense of self-esteem and self-worth, enabling children to thrive. The concept of nurture is embedded in attachment theory and neuroscience. It focuses attention on the importance of social environments and their important influence on social and emotional skills, as well as well-being and behaviour.

- To help reduce the impact of Trauma, ACES and ensure families and individuals are safe from harm, neglect, abuse and exploitation
- Staff will have robust training and ongoing training to be able to identify and respond appropriately to any child or adult safeguarding / protection concerns.
- Muirhead will ensure that they have Risk assessments and risk management measures in place to minimise
  putting others at risk or harm.
- Staff will work in partnership with other agencies that have placed risk management measures in place to minimise risk of harm or abuse.



It is a basic human right to be safe and free from harm, abuse, neglect or exploitation. Abuse , trauma and ACES can be detrimental to a persons well-being , development and impact negatively on relationships, mental health and general health.
